World Mental Health Day is on Tuesday 10th October.

At MTVS we recognise that metal health and wellbeing is of paramount importance for our children to truly thrive. This is reflected in our whole school approach to mental health and wellbeing and detailed in our Mental Health and Wellbeing Policy (which can be found in the Mental Health and Wellbeing section of our website). This ethos and all that we do to boost mental health and wellbeing so far, and what more we can do in the future, will feed into class discussions during next week. The children will also be given a brief introduction to My Happy Mind, which will launch across the school after half-term.

My Happy Mind is a superb, NHS backed, programme that helps boost children's understanding of how their brain works and how they can strengthen and protect their mental health, resilience, and wellbeing. It will complement, and run in addition to, Jigsaw and Zones of Regulation sessions. We will provide you with more information on this, including access to the My Happy Mind app, when we launch. Furthermore, an online presentation to provide additional information on how we utilise the Zones of Regulation is also being prepared and will be sent out to all parents and carers in due course.

Finally, I'd like to take this opportunity to flag two more wellbeing initiatives that we are all very proud of as a school. Following our work across the last academic year, which continues to flourish across the school, we have been awarded a Trauma and Attachment Friendly School award from Virtual Schools. Additionally, as of yesterday evening, 22 members of our staff body have been awarded the qualification of Youth Mental Health First Aider (delivered and certified by Mental Health First Aid England).
